OUR MISSION & VISION

MISSION

To cultivate thriving children and families.

VISION

All children have loving and stable families and a nurturing community empowering them to lead successful lives.

Founded in 1790, Landmarks for Families is an important part of Charleston's historic and cultural heritage, a direct descendant of the Charleston Orphan House, America's first publicly-funded orphanage.

Today, Landmarks for Families provides programs reaching over 860 local children and families each year. Landmarks for Families cares for young people who are victims of physical and sexual abuse, neglect and abandonment, as well as provides resources and support to area families seeking guidance.

Accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA) continuously since 1980, and the Teaching Family Association (TFA) since 2021, Landmarks for Families proudly meets or exceeds evidence-based and trauma-informed standards of care. Landmarks for Families is a member of Child Welfare League of America (CWLA), and the Palmetto Association for Children and Families (PAFCAF).



EDUCATION SERVICES

At Landmarks for Families, Education Services are designed to strengthen families and help them build meaningful support networks. By focusing on relationship-building and essential skill development, the Landmarks for Families team lays the foundation that empowers children and families to thrive.

From parent education and support, to teen skill-building and grief and loss groups, to summer camp and after-school programming, Landmarks for Families' Education Services offers a variety of services tailored to meet children and families where they are. Through workshops, support groups, and one-on-one case management, Landmarks for Families provides caregivers and families with the tools, knowledge, and confidence they need to build strong, resilient futures.



STATISTICS



At Landmarks for Families, education is a powerful tool for strengthening family bonds and creating brighter futures. This past year, Education Services helped 272 children and families come together to build or repair their relationships, and foster a sense of stability, love, and resilience. Through tailored support and guidance, the Landmarks for Families case managers empowered families to overcome challenges, nurture growth, and thrive together as a unit.

BREAKING THE CYCLE: MRS. WELLINGTONS' TRANSFORMATION



When Mrs. Wellington heard about the Strengthening Families Program (SFP), it wasn't through an ad or a flyer—it was from her neighbor. Her neighbor, a single mother of four and a recent program graduate spoke glowingly about how SFP had transformed her family dynamics. Encouraged by her neighbor's testimony, Mrs. Wellington, who is raising her three grandchildren, decided to enroll. She wanted to make a change for the better and ensure her grandchildren grew up in a supportive, understanding household.

For Mrs. Wellington, the experience was more than she could have hoped for. One session stands out as her favorite. The SFP teacher led the session and talked about effective communication. Mrs. Wellington learned how to create a safe, open space where her grandchildren felt comfortable sharing their thoughts and feelings. She realized she had a generational mindset that children should be “seen and not heard.” The program taught her how to break that habit by listening, really listening, to her grandchildren instead of responding with anger or frustration.

“Every day in the program was fun and exciting,” Mrs. Wellington recalls. “I learned something new each time and came home with a better understanding of how to support my family.”

Today, Mrs. Wellington and her grandchildren are thriving, with an open line of communication at the heart of their family. Thanks to Strengthening Families, they've broken old patterns and built a foundation of trust and respect that will guide them for years to come.



PRESERVATION SERVICES

At Landmarks for Families, Preservation Services are designed to keep families safe, connected, and whole during challenging times. Through individualized, in-home support, the skilled team of case managers walk alongside families—guiding them through transitions, helping establish structure, and supporting them in overcoming hardship. By strengthening family relationships and building systems that ensure safety and connection, families can heal, become resilient, and thrive.

Teaching Family® Services

Landmarks for Families case managers use the proven Teaching Family® model to establish structure and stability in the home while coordinating wrap-around services to meet the unique needs of each family. This in-home framework focuses on:

- Improving parental relationships
- Introducing supervision, structure, and discipline in the home
- Enhancing peer associations and community involvement
- Promoting healthy relationships and reducing risk factors

Families eligible to participate in Preservation Services receive **two to four hours of targeted in-home support per week for up to twenty-six weeks**, providing the tools, guidance, and encouragement they need to strengthen their bonds and move toward a brighter future.



STATISTICS



This year 343 children and families in Berkeley, Charleston, and Dorchester counties found strength and resilience through our Preservation Services.

By providing tailored support and resources, our skilled and compassionate case managers have guided these families in a new direction. Together, we're empowering families to thrive and ensuring that children can grow up in safe, nurturing environments.

HOW THE ROADS FAMILY FOUND STRENGTH



In June 2024, Ms. Roads sought support for her family and began working with the Landmarks for Families Preservation Team. She needed help navigating parenting challenges and advocating for her child's education. Through parenting education sessions, she improved communication with her children and gained valuable skills to strengthen her family.

With the guidance of the Landmarks for Families team, she accessed budgeting resources and successfully advocated for her child's educational needs. Together, they worked to secure an assessment for a school accommodation plan, ensuring her child received the necessary support to succeed in the classroom.

Today, she is more self-sufficient and confident, actively advocating for her child while working toward personal goals like improving her credit, securing reliable transportation, and pursuing homeownership. During a recent visit, she expressed deep gratitude for the support and guidance of Landmarks for Families which helped her overcome barriers and connect with the resources she needed.

Thanks to her determination and the support of the Landmarks for Families team, she is now on a positive path, building a brighter future for her family.



RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

When children arrive at Landmarks for Families in need of residential care, they are searching for safety, stability, and a place to call home. For over 230 years, Landmarks for Families has been a refuge for thousands of children and adolescents who have experienced trauma, abuse, or neglect.

As a recognized leader in comprehensive treatment, Landmarks for Families specializes in caring for children and teens who have suffered emotional, physical, and sexual trauma. Each child receives individualized support through customized treatment plans designed to meet their unique needs and help them heal.

Landmarks for Families' four residential cottages provide temporary and long-term care, offering a safe and supportive environment where teens can rebuild their lives. Through educational and evidence-based programs, the team of residential managers provides the teens with the skills, resources, and care to overcome challenges and break the cycle of trauma and abuse.

At Landmarks for Families, every child deserves a nurturing place to heal, grow, and thrive.



SUPPORTING OUR RESIDENTS

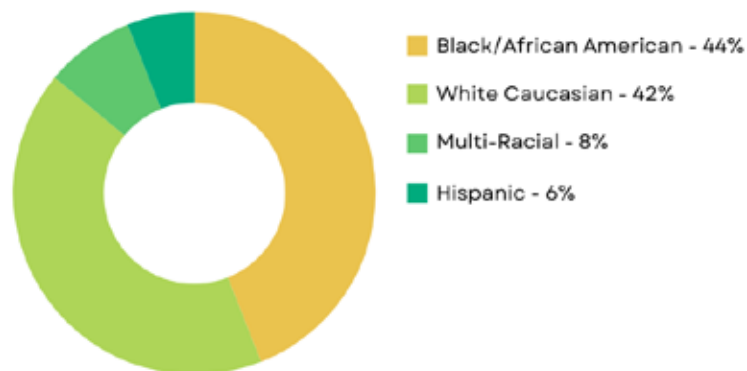

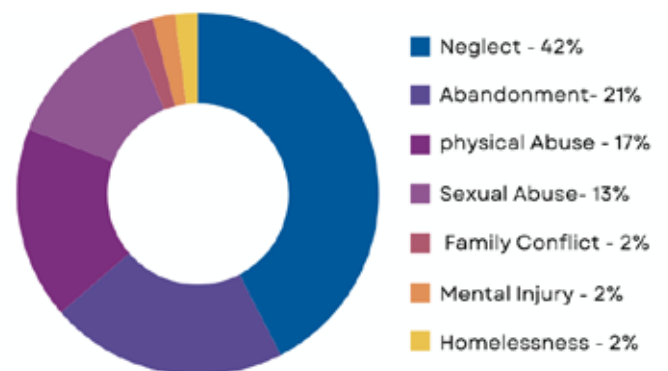

REUNIFICATION SERVICES

Landmarks for Families' Reunification Services provide vital post-permanency support for families who have experienced foster or kinship care. These services focus on strengthening family connections, advocating for resources, and equipping families with the tools they need to thrive.

Family Success Coach Program

Through personalized guidance, education, and enhanced case management, the Landmarks for Families team works directly with families to:

- Problem-solve and navigate challenges
- Improve relationships and family dynamics
- Build resiliency and stability
- Access community resources to keep families together

Children who have exited foster or kinship care due to abuse or neglect often face ongoing risks that can impact their long-term well-being. The Family Success Coach Program is designed to meet these challenges head-on by equipping families with tools and strategies that reduce risk factors and strengthen protective ones—ensuring they remain safe, connected, and supported as they move forward together.



STATISTICS



For the first time in South Carolina, Landmarks for Families is delivering Reunification Services through its Family Success Coach Program. This innovative pilot program is made possible through an award from The Duke Endowment. The children and families served celebrated the opportunity to rebuild and strengthen their bonds through personalized sessions, hands-on support, and family education. Together with The Duke Endowment, Landmarks for Families is responding to the evolving needs of our community.

JOAN'S JOURNEY: A STORY OF STRENGTH AND TRIUMPH



When Joan first joined the Landmarks for Families' Reunification Program, she was overwhelmed. As a single mother of four and the family's sole provider, Joan faced daily challenges—most urgently, her oldest son's struggles at school. His behavioral issues were escalating, and Joan was constantly called away from work to intervene.

But Joan wasn't ready to give up. She had already proven her determination: two years earlier, she fought to reunite her family after her youngest children were placed in kinship care. Through sheer perseverance, Joan met every requirement, secured stable housing

and employment, and brought her family back together. Yet, despite these achievements, Joan still felt alone in navigating the complexities of parenting, work, and her children's needs.

With support from Landmarks for Families and a Family Success Coach, Joan found a partner in her journey. Together, they recognized that her oldest child's needs weren't being fully met at school. Joan, equipped with guidance and encouragement, became her child's strongest advocate, helping him transition to an Individualized Education Plan (IEP). The results were life-changing: her son's behaviors improved, and he began to thrive in school.

This success became a turning point for Joan. Empowered by her progress, she secured a better job, moved her family to a safer neighborhood, and began focusing on building stronger bonds with her children. Joan's story is not just one of overcoming challenges—it's about leading her family toward a brighter future.

At Landmarks for Families, we are proud to walk alongside families like Joan's during critical moments. Joan's strength and commitment to her children are what transformed her family's trajectory—and that's something worth celebrating.

2023-24 EVENTS



In November 2023, Landmarks for Families hosted its Golf Classic at Wild Dunes Resort on the beautiful Links Course! With a total of 24 teams, over \$59,000 was raised to support Landmarks for Families services in Family Education, Preservation, Residential, and Reunification services.



In February 2024, Landmarks for Families hosted its final event under the name Carolina Youth Development Center at the annual A Night for the Children Gala. Over \$275,000 was raised that evening to support the children and families served in 2024. Landmarks for Families alumnus Jacoby Burgess was the featured speaker. He shared his heartfelt story with attendees, reflecting on how the organization helped shape his future and supported him in becoming the first college graduate in his family.



In May 2024, Landmarks for Families was honored to host the first event with its new name! With over 200 participants present at the More Than Shelter Color 5K, over \$41,000 was raised! All proceeds from this event stayed in Berkeley County to support the community families served and the Callen-Lacey Center for Children.

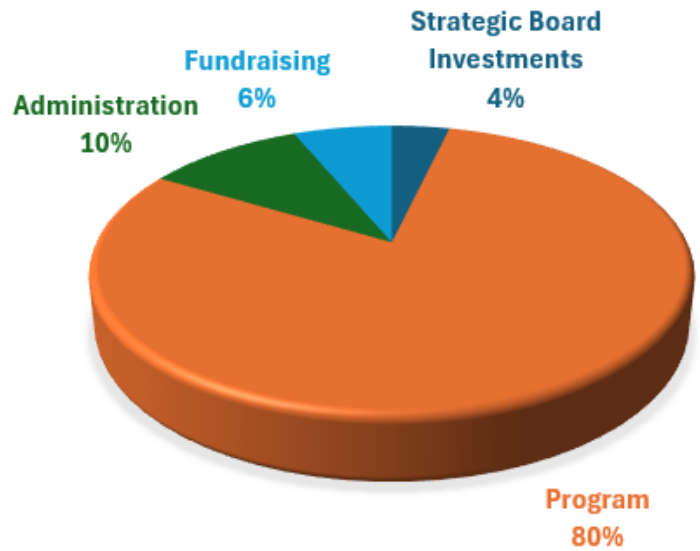

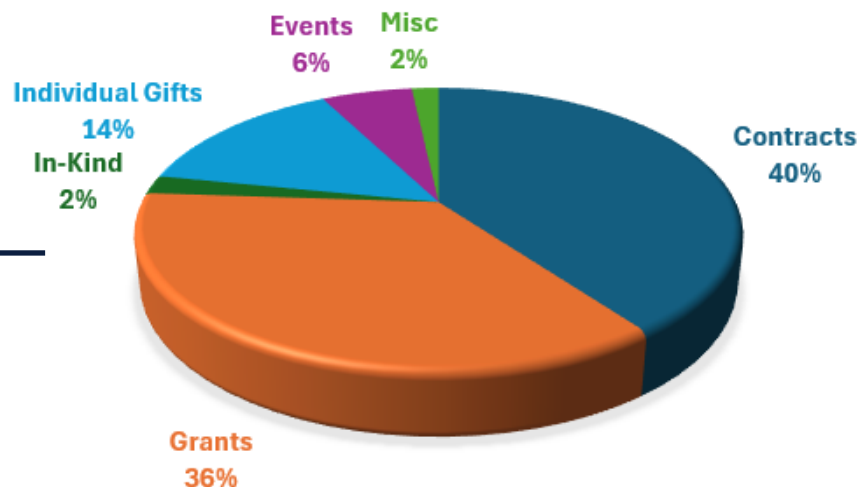
